Overview



Shirakami-Sanchi is a collective term for the extensive mountainous region at the border between Aomori and Akita Prefectures, covering the area from the southwestern part of Aomori Prefecture to the northwestern part of Akita Prefecture. The total area of Shirakami-Sanchi is about 130,000 ha, encompassing areas in both prefectures.

Within the above area, a virgin buna (Fagus crenata, Japanese beech) forest covering an area of 16,971 ha, which is relatively unaffected by humankind, was included on the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites in 1993, together with Yakushima.

World Heritage Site



Most of the areas registered as a World Heritage Site are designated as a Nature Conservation Area under the Nature Conservation Law, and include some natural park areas based on the Natural Parks Law. The site as a whole is designated as a Forest Biosphere Reserve under the regulations of the Forestry

Also, the site as a whole has been designated as a National Wildlife Protection Area for the purpose of preserving wildlife. Fishing has been prohibited in all rivers within the area registered as a World Heritage Site in order to preserve aquatic resources.

The ministry conducts annual monitoring campaigns with a view to ascertaining the condition of the buna forests in the area on an ongoing basis.

The ministry monitors weather conditions through the continuous observation of temperature, wind direction/velocity, rainfall and snowfall in three locations in the area of the World



Monitoring of the number of people entering the area

Since 1999, the ministry has been keeping track of the number of people entering the area in thirteen locations in the World Heritage Site and neighboring areas using automatic measuring instruments. The results are used as basic data for the preservation of the site.

Entering the Core Zone

Entry into the core zone in Aomori Prefecture is only permitted for designated routes and by way of submitting a notification in advance in accordance with the prescribed format. As a general rule, entry into the core zone in Akita Prefecture is prohibited. However, entrance is admitted for specific purposes such as academic research or news broadcasting, by way of obtaining permission in advance.

The designated routes in Aomori Prefecture constitute routes for advanced climbers, which require the skills necessary for climbing streams and traversing bush terrain. Please keep this in mind before entering. Also, please follow the basic rules and etiquette when entering core zones and neighboring areas.

The documents necessary for applying to enter the World Heritage Site area in Aomori Prefecture are available through organizations under the auspices of the Forestry Agency. Numerous deep valleys run intricately through Shirakami-Sanchi. Major rivers within the area include the Kasuge River of the Yoneshiro River Water System in Akita Prefecture and the Iwaki River, Akaishi, Oirase and Sazanai Rivers

Animals

Shirakami-Sanchi includes a primeval buna natural forest that is almost completely free from human influence. Within the entire area of Shirakami-Sanchi, some 14 species of large and mediumsized mammals including the Japanese black bear, the Japanese serow and the Japanese monkey, 13 species of amphibian animals, seven species of reptiles and about 90 species of birds are to be found. Some very rare species of birds, including species of raptors such as the golden eagle and Hodgson's hawk eagle as well as the black woodpecker, Japan's largest woodpecker, inhabit in the area.

Plants

Many kinds of plants other than buna are found in Shirakami-Sanchi, including Japanese wingnut and aesculus forests located near the region's valleys, Japanese white pine and Japanese oak forests located along its mountain ridges, as well as tall herb

grasslands and shrubs on the steep slopes where avalanches frequently occur. More than 500 species of higher plant life has been identified. Some of the plants that grow in the Shirakami-Sanchi include newly discovered species in the area, such as Aomori-mantema and Tsugarumisebaya, or species in danger of extinction, such as Togakushishoma and Rishiri-shinobu.
